## CROSSTABS

**UMass Amherst/WBZ Poll of Massachusetts Registered Voters**

**Field Dates: September 18<sup>th</sup> - September 23<sup>rd</sup>**

**Sample: 600 registered Massachusetts voters**

The survey was conducted by YouGov America (<http://yougov.com>). YouGov interviewed 708 respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 600 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched on gender, age, race, education, ideology, and political interest. YouGov then weighted the matched set of survey respondents to known characteristics of registered voters in Massachusetts from the 2010 American Community Survey using propensity score weighting.

The margin of error for registered voters is 4.4%.
